WEEK 2

4th & 5th Grades Bible Lesson



(Luke 1:26-55)

Supplies: Attached Bible Story Comic Strip, Bible Story Sheet & crayons/markers



- SAY: There once was woman named Mary. Let's make a comic strip as we learn her story.
- 2. GIVE each child a Bible Story Comic Strip, and PLACE the crayons/markers in the center of the group.
- 3. READ the Bible Story Sheet and HELP kids with the drawing prompts as needed.
- 4. After you're finished reading, ASK:
 - What did Gabriel tell Mary? (She was going to have a baby who was going to be God's Son)
 - Whose power did Gabriel say would help Mary? (God) Is anything impossible for God? (No, nothing is impossible for God)
- 5. SAY: It seems like it would be impossible for Mary to have God's Son. Things that are impossible for people to do are not impossible for God. In fact, nothing is impossible for God!

BIBLE STORY SHEET

1.	In the first box on your comic strip, you can <u>draw a girl</u> . This will be Mary. You can <u>give her a happy face</u> . She was happy because she loved God and trusted Him.
	So, give Mary a speech bubble that says, "I love God!" What kind of things do you think Mary did to show love to God? (She probably loved others, sang songs to Him, did what was right, obeyed her parents, etc.)
	When kids are finished drawing in this box, move on to the next one.
2.	Let's move on to the next box in your comic strip! One day God sent an angel named Gabriel to tell Mary some amazing news. You can go ahead and draw an angel with Mary standing beside him, but don't give Mary a face yet.
	The angel greeted Mary and said, "The Lord has blessed you in a special way. He is with you."
	Now, you can give Mary a scared face. She was scared because she had never seen an angel before. Mary didn't know if this angel's visit was a good thing or a bad thing! How would you feel if you saw an angel? (Allow responses)
	When kids are finished drawing in this box, move on to the next one.
3.	Let's finish our comic strips by completing the last box. In this one, draw the angel again, and also draw Mary, but make her belly big, like there's a baby inside!
	The angel said to Mary, "Don't be afraid. God is pleased with you, and you will have a son. His name will be Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of God Most High."
Nothing is impossible. for Goal!	Mary wondered how it would be possible for her to have God's Son, so she asked the angel, "But how can this be? I'm not married yet."
	The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come down to you, and God's power will make it happen Nothing is impossible for God!" You can give the angel a speech bubble and write what he said, "Nothing is impossible for God."
	You can also <u>draw a happy face on Mary</u> . Even though Mary didn't understand how God would give her a baby, she believed that God could do anything. So she said, "I am the Lord's servant. Let it happen as you have said."
	While kids finish drawing in this box, ASK the review questions in

the lesson.
