Pre-K-3rd BIBLE LESSON



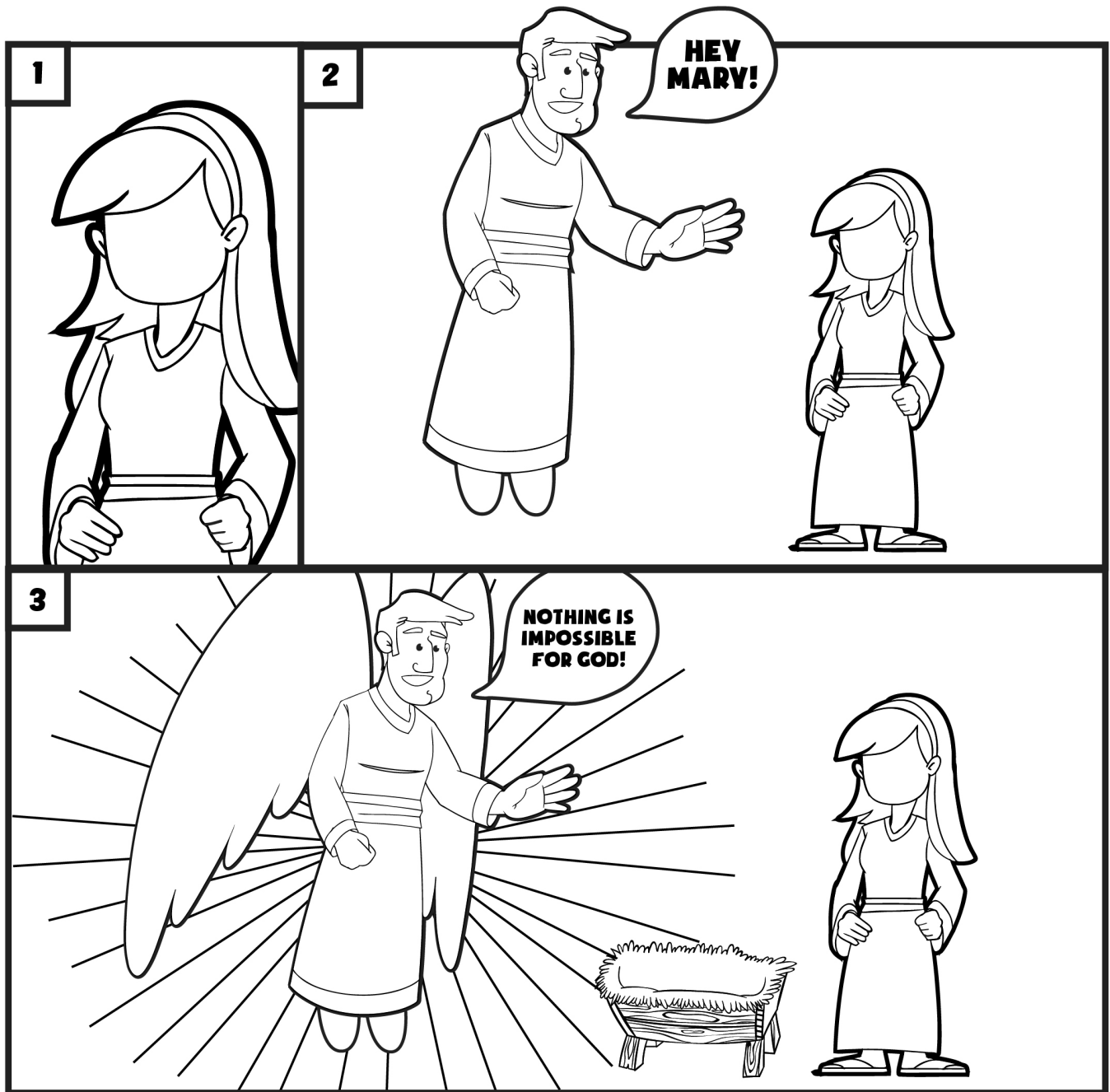
Need to Know: *Nothing Is Impossible for God Bible Story: An Angel Visits Mary (Luke 1:26-55)*

Supplies: *Attached Bible Story Comic Strip, Bible Story Sheet, crayons/markers*

1. SAY: *There once was woman named Mary. Let's make a comic strip as we learn her story.*
2. GIVE each child a **Bible Story Comic Strip**, and PLACE **crayons/markers** in the center of the group.
3. READ the **Bible Story Sheet** to the group, and HELP kids with the drawing prompts as needed.
4. After you're finished reading, ASK:
 - ***What did Gabriel tell Mary: she would have a son or she won a trip to the North Pole?***
(She would have a son) ***You got it!***
 - ***Whose power did Gabriel say would help Mary? (God's) Is anything impossible for God?***
(No, nothing is impossible for God)
5. SAY: ***It seems like it would be impossible for Mary to have God's Son. Things that are impossible for people to do aren't impossible for God. Nothing is impossible for God!***

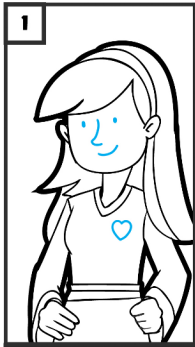


Today's Need to Know: Nothing Is Impossible for God

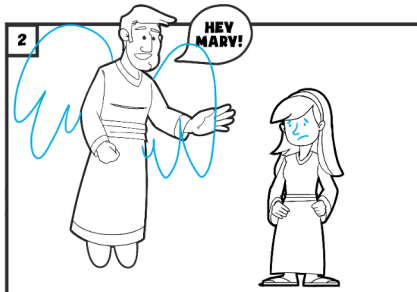


The girl in the first box on your comic strip is Mary. You can give her a happy face. She was happy because she loved God and trusted Him.

So you can also draw a heart on the top of her dress, near where her heart would be. What kind of things do you think Mary did to show love to God? (She probably loved others, sang songs to Him, did what was right, obeyed her parents, etc.)

When kids are finished drawing in this box, move on to the next one.

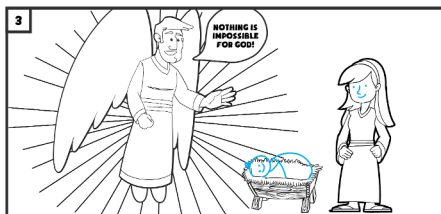
Let's move on to the next box in your comic strip! One day God sent an angel to tell Mary some amazing news. You can go ahead and draw wings on the angel.

The angel greeted Mary and said, "The Lord has blessed you in a special way. He is with you."

You can also go ahead and give Mary a scared face. She had never seen an angel before. Mary didn't know if this angel's visit was a good thing or a bad thing! How would you feel if you saw an angel? (Allow responses)

When kids are finished drawing in this box, move on to the next one.

Now, let's finish our comic strips by completing the last box. I will tell you what to draw next!

The angel said to Mary, "Don't be afraid. God is pleased with you, and you will have a son. His name will be Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of God Most High."

Now you can draw a baby in the manger between Mary and the angel.

Mary wondered how it would be possible for her to have God's Son, so she asked the angel, "But how can this be? I'm not married yet."

The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come down to you, and God's power will make it happen... Nothing is impossible for God!"

Go ahead and draw a happy face on Mary. Even though Mary didn't understand how God would give her a baby, she believed that God could do anything. So she said, "I am the Lord's servant. Let it happen as you have said."
