#### WEEK 5 | K-3 | PARENT LESSON GUIDE

**Need to Know:** I Can Talk to God Anywhere **Bible Story:** How Jesus and His Believers Prayed

Bible Reference: Luke 5:15-16, Mark 1:35, Matthew 26:36,

Acts 12:1-17



#### **READ THE BIBLE**

DO

- Read **Bible Story Sheet** aloud to the group, and have kids clap every time they hear the word "pray."
- Give each child a Bible Story Review Sheet, and place the coloring utensils in the center of the group.
- Read each question from the Bible Story Review Sheet, and allow kids to respond as they color/draw.
- For the bottom box, the word "Anywhere" is written backwards. Have kids write it correctly, assisting as needed.

#### **LET'S PRAY**

SAY

Help kids practice praying by saying the following. Then, close this time with a short prayer.

- Everyone close your eyes. Now picture your bedroom. What is something you can thank God for in your bedroom? Tell Him! (Give kids a quiet moment to pray)
- With your eyes still closed, picture your school. What is something you can thank God for there? Tell Him! Is there something you may need while you're at school? Ask Him! (Give kids a guiet moment to pray)
- Now think about your favorite place to go. What is something you can thank God for there? Tell Him! Is there something you may need while you're there? Ask Him! (Give kids a quiet moment to pray, then say a short prayer to close)

### LET'S PRACTICE

DO

- 1. Give kids the "Let's Practice" Game Board sheet along with an item to use as a **game piece** (examples: button, small rock, coin, etc.).
- 2. Divide the group into two teams, and allow each team to take turns rolling **a die** (use from any game you already have or write numbers on small pieces of paper, fold, and place in a basket to draw from).
- 3. After the team member rolls (or draws number), instruct the entire team to move their game pieces forward based on the number the die lands on. Read a question from the **Leader Guide** based on where the team lands on the board.
- 4. The first team to reach "Finish" is the winner. If time allows, play the game again.

SAY

This game helped us remember how we can pray no matter where we are because we can talk to God anywhere! Let me hear you say this after me:

I Can (thumbs to chest)
Talk to God (make praying hands)
Anywhere (spin around)

## **MEMORIZE IT**

#### DO

- 1. Show the **Memory Verse Card** and have kids repeat the verse after you several times with the motions.
- 2. Place **coloring utensils** in the center of the group. Allow kids to complete **additional Activity Sheets**.
- 3. As kids color, have them take turns saying the memory verse to you. Help as needed.

## **BIBLE STORY SHEET**

Directions: Read the story below, having kids clap every time they hear the word "pray."

Jesus is the best example of how to <u>pray</u> everywhere you go! Even though He was God's Son, Jesus made sure He got quiet to <u>pray</u> and spend time with His heavenly Father. One of the times Jesus liked to get quiet and <u>pray</u> was in the morning.

In the book of the Bible called Mark, Jesus had spent the evening healing and helping people. Instead of sleeping in the next day because He was tired, Jesus got up before the sun came up to find a quiet place to <u>pray</u>.

Jesus knew that nothing was more important than His friendship with God. Even when Jesus was busy helping crowds of people, He would get away by Himself to <u>pray</u> and talk to God. He would also be quiet and listen to what God had to say.


In another book of the Bible called Matthew, we see that Jesus was with His friends outside in a garden. He told them to stay where they were so He could get alone to <u>pray</u>. Jesus knew if He made time to <u>pray</u> and get quiet with God, He could hear what His Father had to say. When we take time to <u>pray</u> and listen to God, we can hear Him, too! No matter where you are or where you go, you can make it a habit to get quiet and <u>pray</u> anywhere!

That's what one of Jesus's best friends, Peter, learned after following Jesus for three years. And we can see in a book of the Bible called Acts that Peter taught other people how to follow Jesus and <u>pray</u>, too. Peter loved God and loved telling other people about Jesus, but he got in trouble for doing it and was put in jail. Peter's friends were very worried, and they knew they needed God's help. So they began to <u>pray</u> and didn't stop asking for God to set Peter free from jail.

God heard Peter's friends <u>pray</u> and sent an angel to visit Peter in jail. Peter was asleep between two guards when the angel appeared and said to him, "Quick! Get up! Get dressed! Follow me!" At first, Peter thought he was dreaming. He followed the angel out of the jail and into the city.

Peter went to Mary's house where his friends had gathered together to <u>pray</u> for him. When Peter's friends opened the door they were amazed that God had heard them <u>pray</u> and had freed Peter from jail!

These true stories show us that we can pray anywhere!




