

# WEEK 5 | K-3 | PARENT LESSON GUIDE

**Need to Know:** I Can Talk to God Anywhere

**Bible Story:** How Jesus and His Believers Prayed

**Bible Reference:** Luke 5:15-16, Mark 1:35, Matthew 26:36, Acts 12:1-17



## READ THE BIBLE

- DO**
- Read **Bible Story Sheet** aloud to the group, and have kids clap every time they hear the word "pray."
  - Give each child a **Bible Story Review Sheet**, and place the **coloring utensils** in the center of the group.
  - Read each question from the Bible Story Review Sheet, and allow kids to respond as they color/draw.
  - For the bottom box, the word "Anywhere" is written backwards. Have kids write it correctly, assisting as needed.

## LET'S PRAY

- SAY**
- Help kids practice praying by saying the following. Then, close this time with a short prayer.
- *Everyone close your eyes. Now picture your bedroom. What is something you can thank God for in your bedroom? Tell Him! (Give kids a quiet moment to pray)*
  - *With your eyes still closed, picture your school. What is something you can thank God for there? Tell Him! Is there something you may need while you're at school? Ask Him! (Give kids a quiet moment to pray)*
  - *Now think about your favorite place to go. What is something you can thank God for there? Tell Him! Is there something you may need while you're there? Ask Him! (Give kids a quiet moment to pray, then say a short prayer to close)*

## LET'S PRACTICE

- DO**
1. Give kids the "Let's Practice" Game Board sheet along with an item to use as a **game piece** (examples: button, small rock, coin, etc.).
  2. Divide the group into two teams, and allow each team to take turns rolling a **die** (use from any game you already have or write numbers on small pieces of paper, fold, and place in a basket to draw from).
  3. After the team member rolls (or draws number), instruct the entire team to move their game pieces forward based on the number the die lands on. Read a question from the **Leader Guide** based on where the team lands on the board.
  4. The first team to reach "Finish" is the winner. If time allows, play the game again.

- SAY**
- This game helped us remember how we can pray no matter where we are because we can talk to God anywhere! Let me hear you say this after me:*
- I Can** (thumbs to chest)  
**Talk to God** (make praying hands)  
**Anywhere** (spin around)

## MEMORIZE IT

### DO

1. Show the **Memory Verse Card** and have kids repeat the verse after you several times with the motions.
2. Place **coloring utensils** in the center of the group. Allow kids to complete **additional Activity Sheets**.
3. As kids color, have them take turns saying the memory verse to you. Help as needed.

# BIBLE STORY SHEET

Wk 5 - K-5 - Bible Story Sheet

Directions: Read the story below, having kids clap every time they hear the word "pray."

***Jesus is the best example of how to pray everywhere you go! Even though He was God's Son, Jesus made sure He got quiet to pray and spend time with His heavenly Father. One of the times Jesus liked to get quiet and pray was in the morning.***

***In the book of the Bible called Mark, Jesus had spent the evening healing and helping people. Instead of sleeping in the next day because He was tired, Jesus got up before the sun came up to find a quiet place to pray.***

***Jesus knew that nothing was more important than His friendship with God. Even when Jesus was busy helping crowds of people, He would get away by Himself to pray and talk to God. He would also be quiet and listen to what God had to say.***

***In another book of the Bible called Matthew, we see that Jesus was with His friends outside in a garden. He told them to stay where they were so He could get alone to pray. Jesus knew if He made time to pray and get quiet with God, He could hear what His Father had to say. When we take time to pray and listen to God, we can hear Him, too! No matter where you are or where you go, you can make it a habit to get quiet and pray anywhere!***

***That's what one of Jesus's best friends, Peter, learned after following Jesus for three years. And we can see in a book of the Bible called Acts that Peter taught other people how to follow Jesus and pray, too. Peter loved God and loved telling other people about Jesus, but he got in trouble for doing it and was put in jail. Peter's friends were very worried, and they knew they needed God's help. So they began to pray and didn't stop asking for God to set Peter free from jail.***

***God heard Peter's friends pray and sent an angel to visit Peter in jail. Peter was asleep between two guards when the angel appeared and said to him, "Quick! Get up! Get dressed! Follow me!" At first, Peter thought he was dreaming. He followed the angel out of the jail and into the city.***

***Peter went to Mary's house where his friends had gathered together to pray for him. When Peter's friends opened the door they were amazed that God had heard them pray and had freed Peter from jail!***

***These true stories show us that we can pray anywhere!***

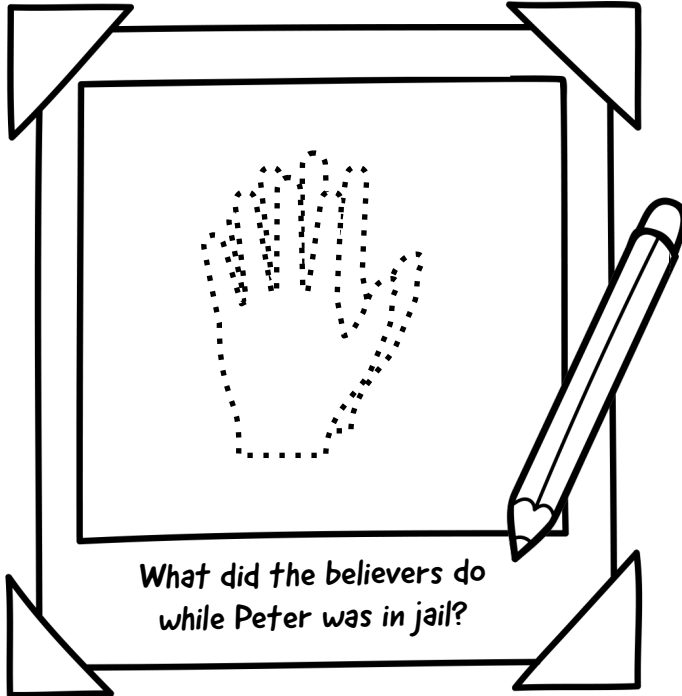

# LEADER GUIDE

Wk 5 - K-3 - Leader Guide

As kids' game pieces land near these sections of the game board, ask them one of the questions below.

If the game piece lands on a ladder, ask them how it feels to move ahead or backward. Remind kids that they can talk to God and tell Him how they feel (excited, happy, mad, frustrated) when they feel like this in real-life!

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>What is something you can praise God for?</b> (Allow responses)</li> <li>• <b>Where is your favorite place to go?</b> (Allow responses) <b>What is something you could praise God for there?</b> (Allow responses)</li> <li>• <b>Do you like to be outside or inside?</b> (Allow responses) <b>Can you still praise God if you are in the place that you don't really like?</b> (Yes)</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>God loves you so much, even when you do things that are wrong. Is it easy or hard for you to tell someone when you do something wrong?</b> (Allow responses) <b>You don't ever have to worry about God being mad at you. He loves you and will forgive you!</b></li> <li>• <b>If you do something wrong at school, should you try to hide it from God or tell God?</b> (Tell God) <b>Yes! God loves you! He will forgive you for doing wrong things at school, but He wants you to tell Him when you are sorry and ask Him to help you not continue doing wrong things.</b></li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Do you know anyone who is sick or hurt and needs God to heal them?</b> (Allow responses) <b>Let's say a prayer now and ask God to help them.</b> (Say a short prayer for the needs mentioned)</li> <li>• <b>Have you ever been sick and had to go to the doctor?</b> (Allow responses) <b>God heals and helps us in many ways! One of those ways is by using great doctors and nurses to help heal us when we are sick! If you ever feel scared when you're at the doctor, you can pray and talk to God about it! Then trust that God is working through the doctors and nurses to help you!</b></li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>If you hold an armful of rocks, would it feel heavy or light?</b> (Heavy) <b>That's right! The things we worry about can feel heavy, like we're carrying rocks around with us. But God doesn't want us to feel that way. He wants us to tell Him about everything we're worried about and ask Him for help. Is there anything making you feel worried or nervous?</b> (Allow responses) <b>Let's pray now and ask God to help you!</b> (Say a short prayer for the needs mentioned)</li> <li>• <b>Is there anything that makes you feel scared or upset?</b> (Allow responses) <b>God wants to take that heavy feeling or fear away. Let's pray and ask Him to help you now!</b> (Say a short prayer for the needs mentioned) <b>See, church is one place we can pray!</b></li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>When you are talking to a friend, do you only talk or do you talk and listen?</b> (Talk and listen) <b>The same is true when we pray and talk to God. God wants to talk to you, and it helps if we can get quiet and listen to Him. Where is somewhere in your home that you can go to get quiet and listen?</b> (Allow responses)</li> <li>• <b>Is it hard for you to sit still and be quiet?</b> (Allow responses) <b>God understands! He will help you! When you pray, tell Him you want to hear Him talk to you. Tell Him that it's hard to listen and be still, and ask Him to help you wherever you are!</b></li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Do you believe that God has good plans for you?</b> (Allow responses) <b>He does! You can say, "Yes!" to what He has for you because you know He has the best in mind for you!</b></li> <li>• <b>Is it hard for you to say, "Yes," when you don't really want to do something?</b> (Allow responses) <b>Even if what God says to do in the Bible isn't what we want to do, we can still say, "Yes," and do it His way because we know it's what is best.</b></li> </ul>

(make praying hands)

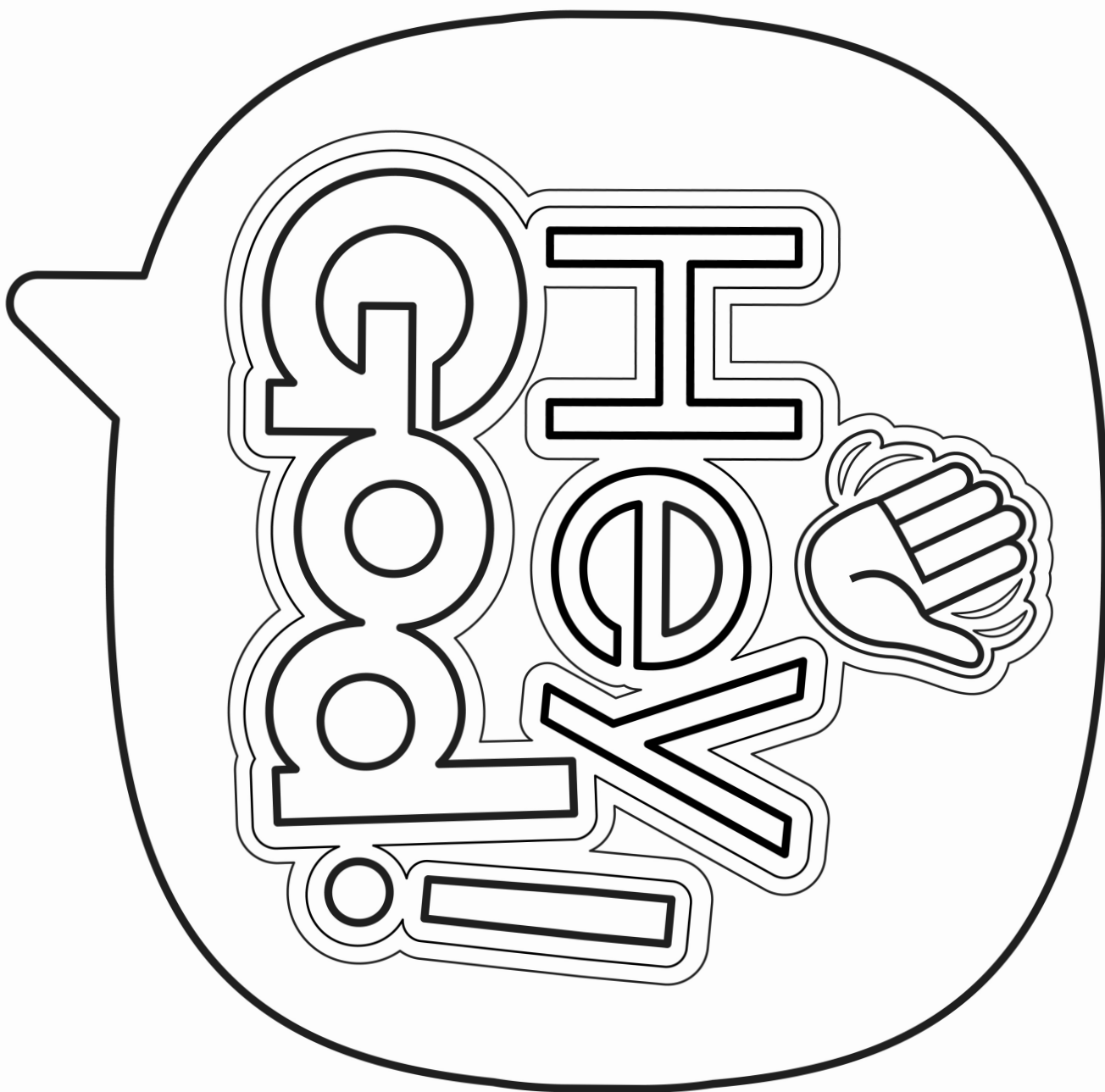
***and give thanks to Him.”***

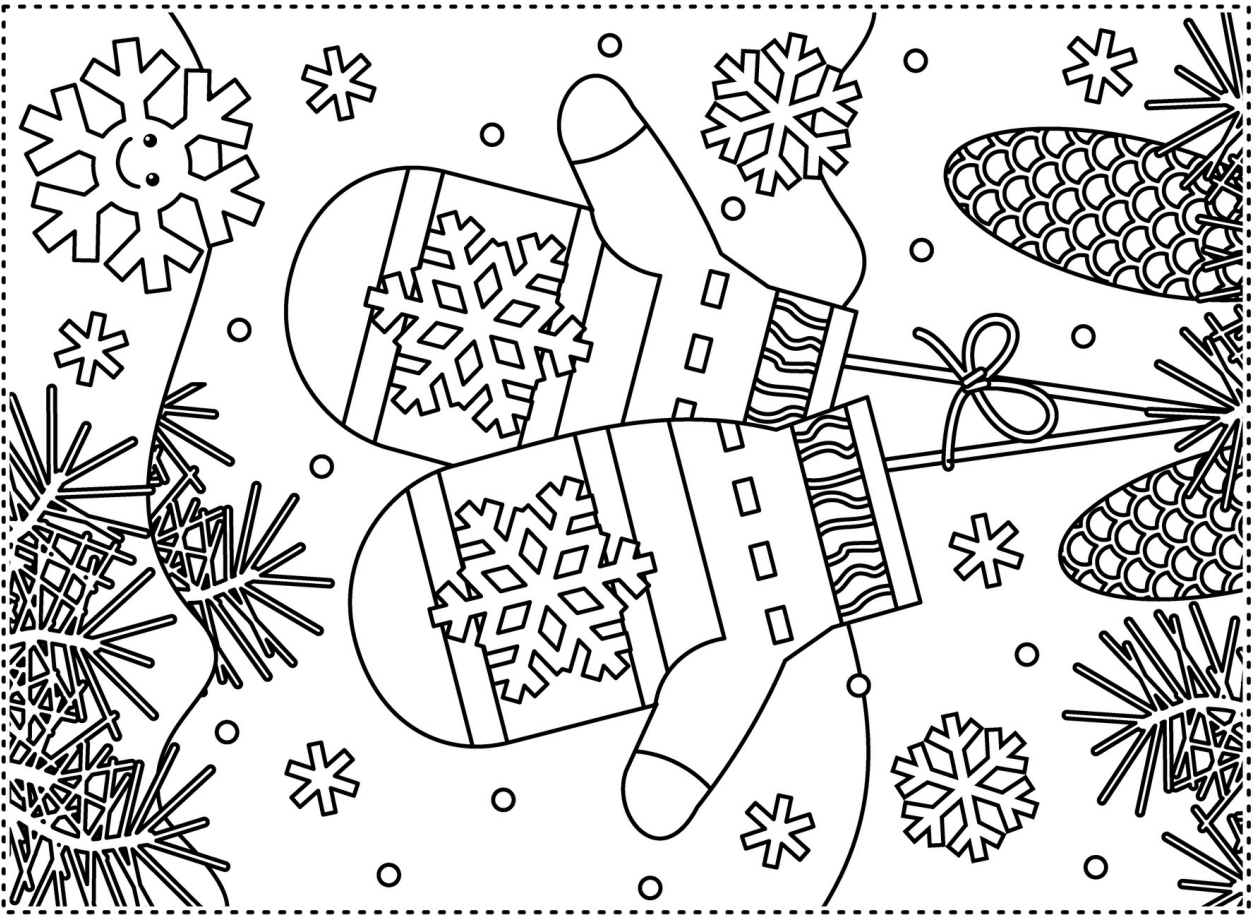

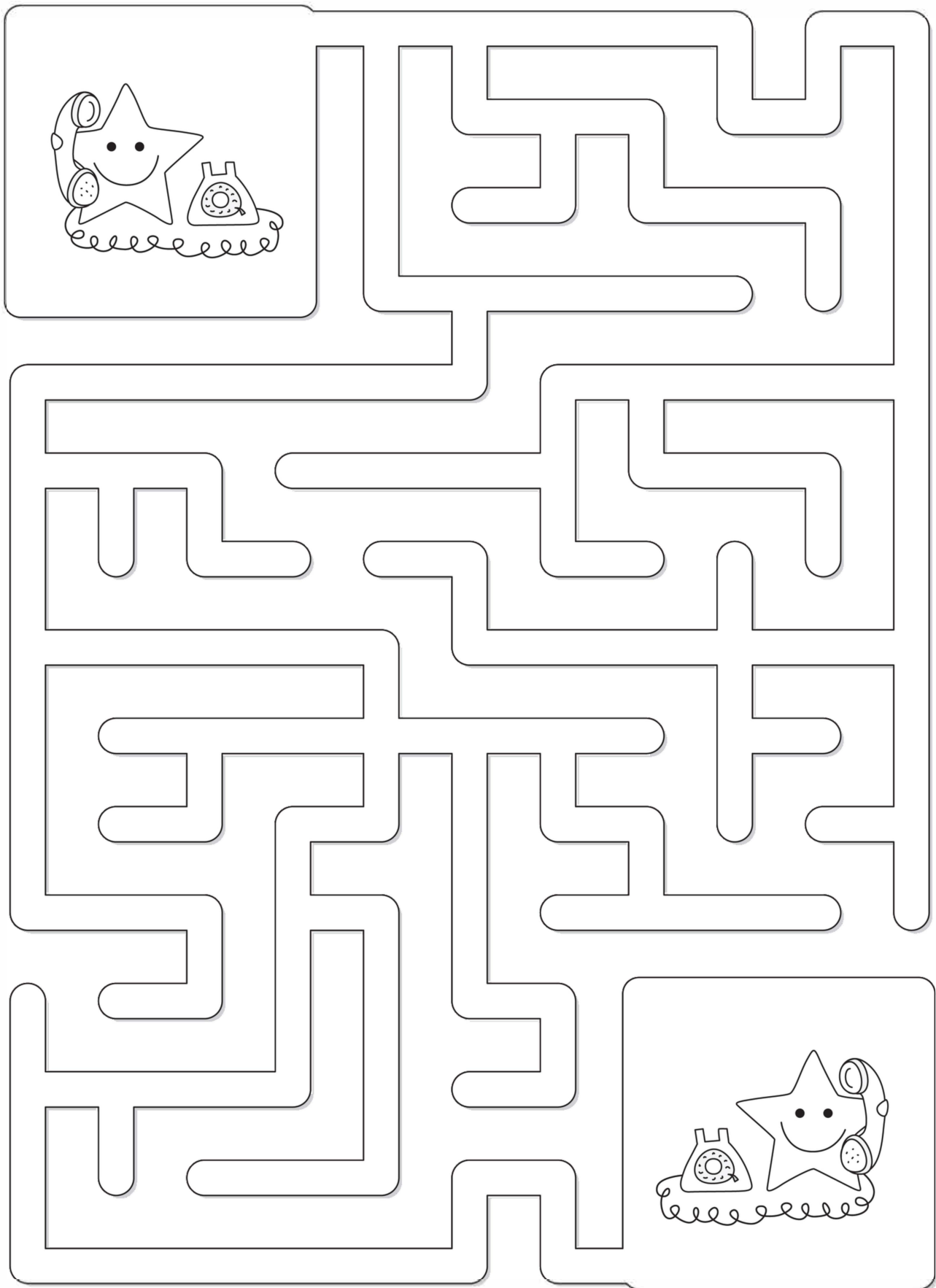
